

HomeEducation

Home education was the only form of education since before antiquity. Although many ancient civilizations developed education centers, primarily for men, children learned everything from the home.

In the 1800s, because of wars and financial crisis in this country, both parents found themselves in the workforce. This created a need for the development of schools from kindergarten through to college. Because the two incomes in the home were allowing parents to provided more for their families, as well as women enjoyed working, the school became a major necessity for educating American students.

As the education system grew and organized, students being educated at home dramatically decreased, and the norm for education in America became students going to school away from the home. Ironically, home education began to receive a negative connotation around the county.

Let's fast forward into the twenty-first century. The buzz word in education is "options." Today, mainly because of global changes in employment, education delivery for students has become three-fold: 1. home, 2. classroom, and 3. online.

Therefore the option to return to the home for parental involvement and management in education has made a full circle. AA-YP has been on the forefront for over sixteen years facilitating the opportunity for parents to educate their students from home. Frankly, it is a tradition that will ALWAYS finds it place in American Education.

HOME EDUCATION (HE) COVER

In the State of Alabama, a student can be home educated under certain conditions which are as follows: the parent is a state certified teacher, the student is under an approved or accredited cover, ie. church school or a private school, or if a student is ill and the school has allowed the education to take place at home. A parent should check with their State Department of Education to find out the requirements to home educate their student.

HomeEducation is on of the most rewarding opportunities to teach your student(s). However, it very serious and non-compliance can lead to dismissal from the cover, as well as legal trouble with the State. If out with your student(s) during regular school hours, you will need to have a student ID card for your student, in the event, you are questioned by police about your student no being in school. They have the authority to question your student, as well as contact ing the cover. Truancy officers can be sent to your home if deemed necessary. Do your due diligence and enjoy this opportunity to impact your student(s) education and personal growth.

THE HE CHECK LIST

You will need to submit some documents and develop other documents.

- Enrollment Under the Education Division of AA-YP Submit this document, immediately with the applicable fees.
- Parent Agreement Affidavit submit this notarized document.
- Know the HE Requirements design your rules and requirements with your student.
- Student Development Plan design your student development plan. How will you assess and teach throughout the year.
- Student Academic Goals and Interests What should be academic goals for your student? What are your students interests?
- Homeschool Learning Outcomes What is the desired outcome for the student this academic year.
- School Year Schedule develop your schedule for the academic year.
- Books, Materials, and Resources List declare your main curriculum.
- Monthly Lesson Plan Submit this document the last Friday of each month.
- Assessment and Evaluation Plan Students must be tested by Sylvan Learning Systems in Math, Language/Grammar, & Reading Comprehension for grade equivalency in May.
- Educator Professional Development Plan TBD by the HE administrator.
